## Background on the trainer

Anne-Marie, Director of The Annex Project (UK), is in Australia to deliver an interactive workshop where the participants will be helped to better understand the impact of early developmental trauma for children and young people and how to improve the outlook for young people who display complex and challenging behaviours.

The model is based on the work of Dr. Daniel Hughes, Dr. Julie Hudson and Dr. Kim Golding and is embedded strongly in attachment theory. It will also bring in the work of Pat Crittenden who has an attachment model (DMM) that supports Carers understanding the meaning behind behaviors young people demonstrate.
